Notice to all Members regarding membership and club fees

Citizens Advice helping people to claim for Universal Credit Help to Claim:

From 1st April Citizens Advice Bracknell & District will be helping people claim Universal Credit, by offering advice and support, from making the claim until the first correct payment is received. They will give support and advice on:

- whether Universal Credit is the right benefit to be claiming
- making a claim on-line, or via alternative channels if appropriate
- submitting the necessary information to support a claim
- managing the first few weeks until the first payment is received
- what do to if the first payment isn't right, or if Universal Credit is refused

How to access the service:

- Drop in to our Bracknell Office to make an appointment
- Via Bracknell Job Centre Plus which can refer claimants directly

CMG Launches Pioneering Easy-Read Transgender Guide

CMG, a leading provider of support for people with learning disabilities and associated complex needs, has joined forces with charities CHANGE and Choice Support to launch an easy-read Transgender guide, providing support and advice to individuals across the country. In the first of its kind, the easy read guide explains to individuals with learning disabilities and/or autism what it means to be transgender; the issues or

challenges that may be experienced; and to help them understand their thoughts, feelings and gender identity. The pioneering booklet enables individuals to be better informed about everyday issues that affect people who have or are thinking of transitioning, and incorporated contributions from many people across the many months of its development. The Guide was launched at the national Learning Disability England Conference and is freely available from CMG, Change and Choice Support Websites, as well as accessible via the Supported Loving Network Facebook page and website.

We are a small charity based in Camberley which provides an ASD friendly, real working environment, fostering independence and building work skills for individuals aged 16 years and older with autism. This is achieved through either work experience sessions or as appropriate by the ASDAN Employability programme. Our bespoke training, delivery and environment provides young adults with autism the opportunity to learn retail, office, manufacturing, photography, social media, hospitality and housekeeping skills. This teaching takes place at the charity training centre and 'Polly's Place' which is a shop and art gallery selling handcrafted gifts.
