GATEWAY

What is the Mencap Gateway Award?

The Gateway Award is a programme of activities, designed to give adults with learning disabilities and/or autism the opportunity to:

- o Experience real challenges
- Express creativity
- o Increase confidence and independence
- Gain a sense of personal achievement

How does it work?

There are three levels: *Bronze, Silver* and *Gold*. Bronze will take about a year to complete and then further levels may take longer to complete.

On completion of each Award level an Award Ceremony will be held where participants will be presented with a Gateway Award certificate and badge.

Workshops are held once a week on Thursday evenings and cost £5 per session. The enrolment fee is £21 for the Awards and is payable after a trial period.

Participants need to be members of Wokingham, Bracknell & Districts Mencap, which also gives access to many other clubs and services. (Membership costs £15, and is payable yearly each January)

Other charges may be incurred for some projects, such as Fitness or Adventure Challenge units. Participants will need sensible walking shoes in order to take part in the hike during early summer.

BLUE BADGE CHANGES

The changes that the Government promised to make to the Blue Badge Scheme last summer came into force in August. The expanded eligibility criteria will mean that many more autistic people will qualify for a Blue Badge. The old rules were too focussed on people's physical ability to walk, and changes to Government guidance in 2014 meant that autistic people found it too hard to get a Blue Badge. **Under the new rules** there will be two important new ways that autistic people may qualify for a Blue Badge:

You could be eligible subject to a further assessment if you can't undertake a journey without being at risk of serious harm, if it causes 'very considerable psychological distress' or if you have very considerable difficulty when walking.

You should be automatically eligible if you have qualified for PIP Mobility Component and have scored exactly 10 points for 'planning and making a journey' because making a journey caused 'overwhelming psychological distress'.

Children who get Higher Rate Mobility Disability Living Allowance will also continue to qualify, as before.

Not all autistic people need a Blue Badge. But it can be a lifeline for many autistic people and their families – helping them to go out in ways other people take for granted. If you think you could be eligible for a Blue Badge, check online with the **Gov eligibility checker**
