## Notice to all Members regarding membership and club fees

This is a reminder that everyone accessing our clubs and activities must be a fully paid up member of Wokingham, Bracknell & Districts Mencap in order to ensure they are covered by our insurance. (The membership fee is £15 per year and is due on 1<sup>st</sup> January every year).

All our clubs and activities are now funded through club fees and most are invoiced on a termly or yearly basis (@ the Acorn – yearly and Youth Club @ Addington - termly). To keep the clubs running, we need all participants to pay the relevant annual Club fee (this covers staff and volunteer costs, publicity and stationery costs, hall hire, activity costs etc). Participants will be invoiced for this fee and if it is an annual invoice then you can pay by instalments.

Unfortunately if you do not pay the invoice within 30 days of receiving it, you will have to pay double the weekly fee when you attend a Club. *If we do not receive enough club fees, then sadly clubs may have to close* Please note that if you do not pay the Wokingham, Bracknell & Districts Mencap membership and Club fees, unfortunately, you will not be allowed to continue to participate in any of the activities.

This policy was agreed by the board of Trustees on 31st January 2019 and is effective from 1st March 2019.

# **Sunflower Lanyard**

If you are planning to fly from Heathrow then you can obtain a sunflower lanyard which enables staff to recognise that you have a hidden disability without you needing to declare it. This allows you to travel independently through the airport whilst knowing that if you need any additional support during your journey, any of the colleagues will be able to support. If you do find you are feeling any discomfort during your journey or would prefer extra assistance, head to one of the Assistance desks where one of the colleagues will be happy to help.
